I am happy to announce we will be doing another “payout” to our community members. It is based on the return on our settlement investments.



LANDS & RESOURCES **DIRECTOR**

Wachiaye MCFN Members,
Happy Harvest, Leaves Falling,
Migrating Moon!

The Lands and Resources Department has been very busy since the Annual Gathering working at managing in a good way, all matters related to Mining, Forestry, Lands, and Waters.

There are now 3 subcommittees for homeland resettlement: The Land Code Subcommittee, The Emergency Management Planning Subcommittee, and the Energy Management Subcommittee. The Land Code Subcommittee will be meeting biweekly throughout the winter, implementing a comprehensive project plan to study existing

land codes part by part, comparing and discussing the options. Every 6 weeks there will be an organized community outreach session to present the parts of the land code that have been examined and discussed, with an opportunity for input and discussion among all interested members. Comments will be compiled, recorded and addressed. In the spring the project will enter its cumulative phase, where the Lands and Resources Department will travel to major centers where Missanabie Cree members reside for a face to face exposition and open discussion.

The Emergency Management Planning Subcommittee recently reinitiated meeting after being on hiatus all summer. We started back up with training in incident and emergency management, and we are currently working on

developing a project plan. The Energy Management Subcommittee has been meeting regularly to explore energy options for the future reserve community. The department is optimistic that MCFN will be awarded funding for a Community Energy Champion so that a fulsome feasibility study can be undertaken in the spring.

The Gold rush continues in Missanabie Cree traditional territories, and we are working diligently to provide environmental monitoring oversight of the existing mine activities and proposed expansion near Dubreuilville as well as to ensure traditional values are not impacted during the flurry of exploration activity near Missanabie and further north toward Hearst. The department is also keeping a

close eye on existing community benefit agreements, to ensure that conditions are being fulfilled.

On the Forestry front, the department meets weekly with Wahkohtowin First Nations in a forestry focus group to discuss matters related to herbicide spray and protection of late winter moose habitat. Despite Mushkegowuk and Wahkohtowin's efforts to end herbicide spray, the Federal government has not been convinced politically to ban its use. The Magpie-Martel Forest (soon to be renamed Missanaibi Forest) was sprayed with glyphosate to kill back competitive shrubs (raspberry, mountain maple) and under-marketable poplar and birch in August of this year. The area sprayed was relatively small. Only one area was sprayed near

Missanabie and this was a harvest block slated for renewal northwest of Eskay Lake aka Boil Bacon Lake. Full details of renewal activities on the Magpie-Martel Forests can be found at <https://nrip.mnr.gov.on.ca/>. Please reach out to your Lands and Resources Department staff if you need assistance with accessing further information. As per the Annual Work Schedule, the closest planned harvest to reserve lands are to the north of Conboy and Butler Lakes.

Regarding waters, the department continues to pursue potential funding programs to complete flood risk mapping of the reserve area to inform future land use planning efforts. We are exploring water monitoring training for the technicians so that they may be better equipped to sample and report on the evidence of metals and

contaminant levels of local lakes and streams.

Regarding species at risk, the emerald ash borer monitoring project field portion was completed in August, and identification of the collected samples for the presence of the beetle is underway. A report will be completed and published before year-end. Species at Risk in the traditional territories, includes the Canada Warbler, the Evening Grosbeak, and Northern Myotis (little brown bat). MCFN has been offered 4 bat houses by donation from Natural Resource Solutions Inc. Once these are constructed and ready for pick up we will get these installed on reserve property to help with habitat restoration of this important winged relative.

Wishing you all an enjoyable fall and early winter season. Be prepared for that snow to fly.



individuals and families who are loving and compassionate.

We have a vision of a people who are bi-cultural and bi-lingual;
a people who can walk in both worlds contributing to our well-being,
the well-being of other Indigenous Peoples; contributing and competing globally.

We have a vision of a Nation of people who respect the dignity of all;
a people who find balance through equality.

We have a vision of people who respect the environment,
harvesting and reaping the resources of the land in a sustainable manner
as responsible stewards for the use of future generations.

We are the Omushkego of the Missanabie Cree Ililiwak;
whose vision it is to regain and restore our rightful place
and through the strength of our people, never again be denied our place in society.
