I want to start by wishing everyone a Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year.

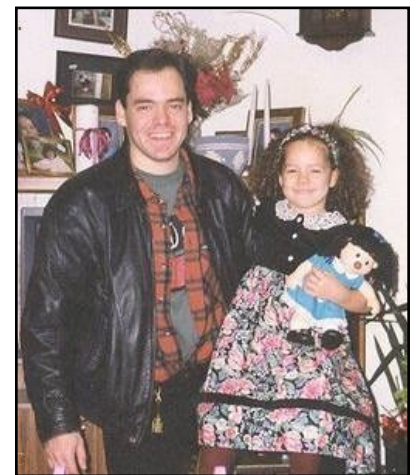

Hello Everyone!

I really do not have much to fill you in on this month. The pending Contribution Benefit Agreement with Prodigy operating as Magino Mines was presented to all members who attended the information sessions held in different locations. Please ensure you understand the document and if you have any questions regarding interpretations, please do not hesitate to call our office for explanation on any situations you do not

understand. Our Chief and Council will want ratification of this agreement soon but if you want my opinion, please feel free to call me.

I suppose you all have heard that two councilors have resigned and C & C have accepted the next two in line for the position; unfortunately, one has taken another position and cannot be a councilor due to employment obligations. Congratulations to both. C & C are dealing with the next person to be councilor at this time and we will be notified as soon as reasonably possible. I have sent an email to our electoral officer for his direction.

Advertising for new camp managers is in this newsletter and we are hoping that a couple will apply as it is a lot of work for one. Please note that this position is responsible to be available 24 hours per day 7 days per week. We are gearing up for developing new positions for the next fiscal year so please keep your eye out for the job postings as they will not be posted for long due to the timing of the government – slow to inform us and they want it done immediately.

I have been on holidays from November 15 to 27, 2016 and I went deer hunting and we were successful – 3 deer.

Then I attended a Muskegowuk Development Corporation meeting in Toronto from Nov. 29 to Dec. 2/16. MDC is a new organization formed to help generate economic development opportunities for all of our seven First Nations on Muskegowuk Council and it is supported by all the Chiefs in our region. On the first day, we were given a Strategic Planning Session to help the board strategize on potential opportunities for the First Nations. Day two started off with a Conflict of Interest Seminar and it pointed a third but very important area that everyone can be in conflict with and it is called “material conflict”.

As we will be entering into contracts with mining companies, we will need a resume and a letter from those who wish to pursue a job in the mining section. Richmond

has agreed to hire four to seven first nation members and train them in their job. If you are interested in pursuing a position with the mine, please send your documents to my office so we can be ready to hire members when the positions are ready. The agreement will be for seven first nation members per year. One of the conditions of the agreements with the mining companies is that we have to have an inventory of people who are available to work in the mine and to show your qualifications. So, if you have any inclination of working in a mine, please send us your resume. This can be a very lucrative opportunity for the youth to start off a career, or for others to gain well-paid employment. The rest is up to you.

We are still in the process of applying for money from the Water Wastewater Management Fund to upgrade Island View Camp. Still have not heard from the government on our proposal to fund training for drillers through the auspices of Austin Powder Limited. With this program, we applied for eight positions as drillers and four positions as blasters so if you are interested, please send your resume and letter indicating your preference. The Sault Ste. Marie community potluck Christmas Party is on the 17th of December in Echo Bay; hope you can make it.

It has been a pleasure and honor everyday so far; while I am working here at Missanabie Cree I will utilize my skills, work ethic and my contacts for the initiatives planned for the future betterment of Missanabie Cree First Nation and its membership. MUSHKEGOWUK COUNCIL ENVIRONMENTAL STEWARD



Dear Missanabie Cree Members,

Hope everyone is well and ready for the upcoming holidays.

I have been attending the C&C meetings regularly as a band mem-

ber but never had a chance to attend the first C&C as a councillor for this new council. Recently two councillors had resigned which left 2 vacant spots for descending councillors to fill. I was called on Friday November 18th by the Missanabie Cree Chief for a meeting regarding the vacant councillor positions. I was offered the councillor position that day and proceeded to attend two Community Benefits Agreement meetings.

I was also in the process of seeking employment and was offered the Mushkegowuk Council Environmental Steward position that I had applied for in early October. Mushkegowuk Council has stated after I had accepted the job that no employee of Mushkegowuk Council can work for their First Nation Council and that it was a conflict as per their employment policy.

I was required to resign from the councillor position to work for Mushkegowuk Council. I regretfully resigned on Friday November 25th and started working at the MCFN office on Monday November 28th.

I will however be working as the Environmental Steward of the Mushkegowuk Territory by monitoring and gathering information to provide reports for the Climate Change Impact Study for the communities. I will also be assisting in the development of the adaptation actions and plans to lessen the risk of harm to the well-being of our communities and community members. The stewards are also expected to build the climate change knowledge and capacity in the Mushkegowuk First Nations.

I am looking forward to working with the community in a different capacity and Merry Christmas to you and your family and Happy New year! Have fun baking all your holiday cookies!

We have a vision of a Nation of people who respect the dignity of all; a people who find balance through equality of all ages, male and female alike.

We have a vision of people who respect the environment, harvesting and reaping the resources of the land in a sustainable manner as responsible stewards for the use of future generations.

We are the Anishnabe of the Missanabie Cree First Nation whose vision it is to regain and restore our rightful place and through the strength of our people, never again be denied our place in society.
